



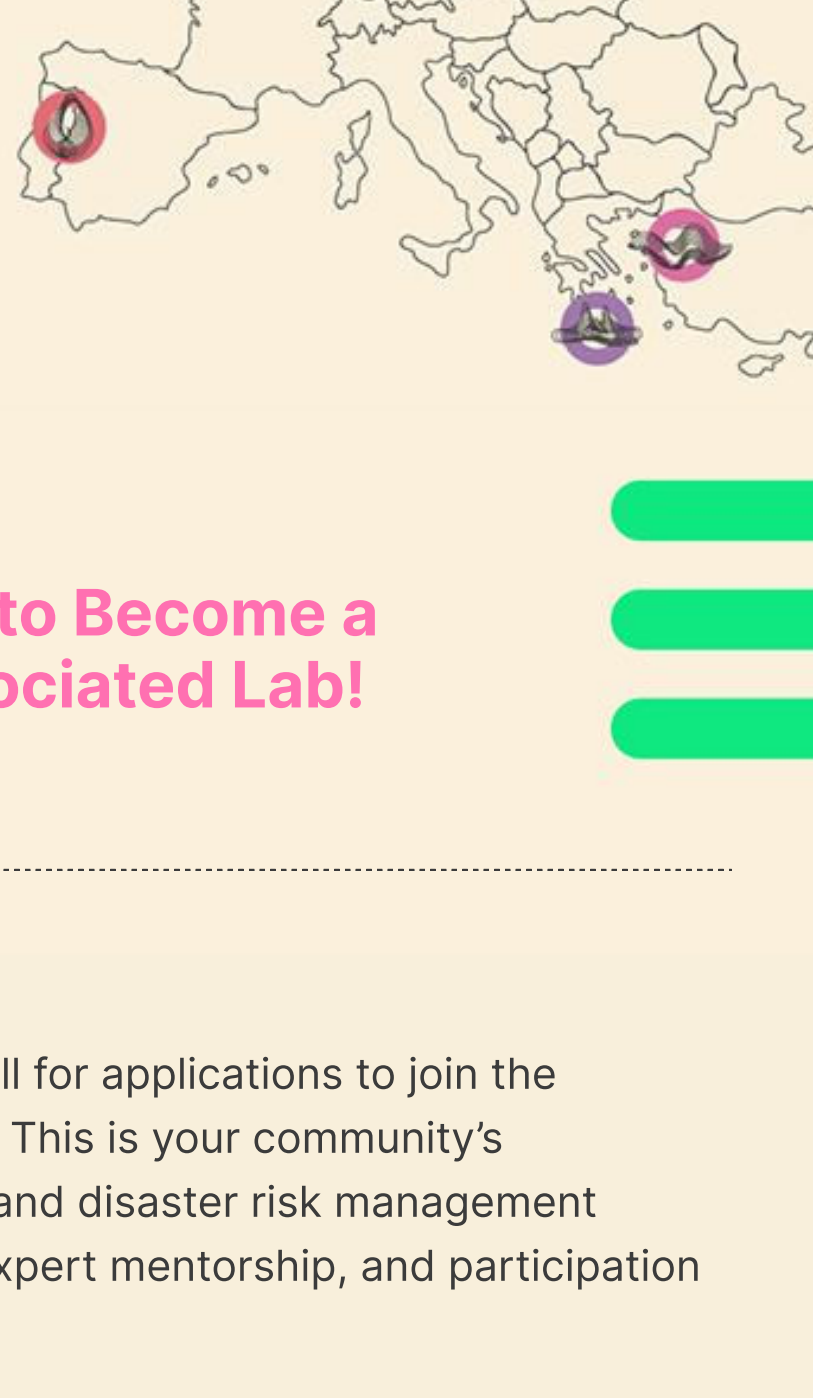

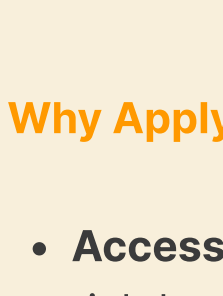

Why Apply? As a CORE Associated Lab, your community will gain:

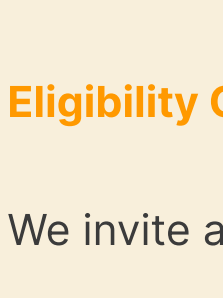
- **Access to Extensive Knowledge:** Tap into the RESILIAGE project's rich knowledge base, best practices, and innovative solutions.

Our CORE Labs Focus Areas

RESILIAGE addresses natural hazards and extreme events related to climate change, focusing on their interconnections and cascading effects, such as landslides in Trondheim, floods in Famenne-Ardenne, wildfires in Naturtejo, heatwaves in Karsiyaka, and earthquakes in Crete. The project supports local communities in identifying needs, issues, and opportunities rooted in their environment and local knowledge. By integrating heritage as a driver for strengthening collaboration, RESILIAGE emphasizes the role of cultural and natural heritage in reducing disaster risk, fostering resilience, and preserving the identity and legacy of the regions affected.

Each of our CORE Lab specialises in an innovation framework:

- **Health and Well-being (Trondheim, Norway):** Focus on physical and psychological well-being during all disaster management phases.
- **Socio-Economic Resilience (Famenne-Ardenne, Belgium):** Enhance local economic recovery and leverage biodiversity and cultural heritage.
- **Social Interaction and Inclusiveness (Naturtejo Geopark, Portugal):** Promote societal connections and inclusivity in disaster management.
- **Adaptive Governance (Karsiyaka, Türkiye):** Innovate governance involving diverse stakeholders for resilient communities.
- **Active Memory (Crete, Greece):** Strengthen community identity and resilience through historical and cultural experiences.



Who can Apply?

Eligibility Criteria

We invite applications from:

- **Government Bodies:** Local/ regional authorities, municipalities.
- **Non-Profit Organisations:** NGOs, community groups.
- **Emergency Services:** First responders, emergency management agencies.
- **Infrastructure Sector:** Infrastructure providers.
- **Educational Institutions:** Knowledge dissemination and learning facilitation.
- **Business Sector:** Private businesses.
- **Cultural Institutions:** Cultural heritage entities.

Applicants should demonstrate proficiency in English, have established local networks, and possess preparedness or prevention plans for local hazards.

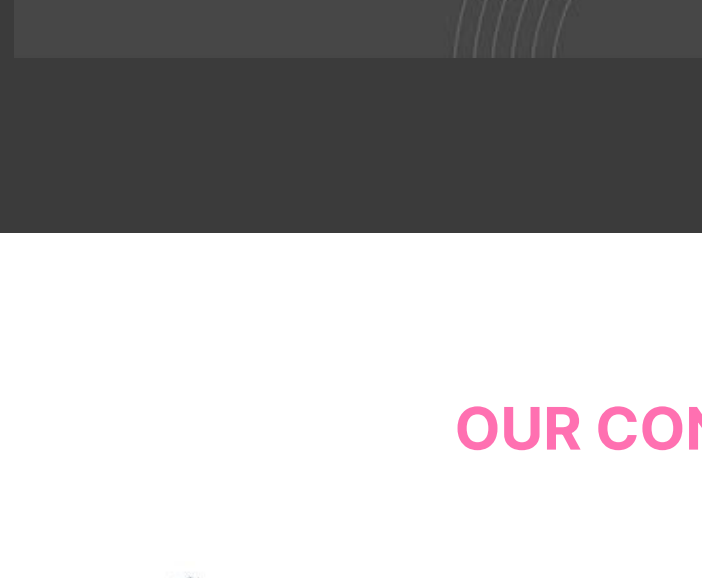

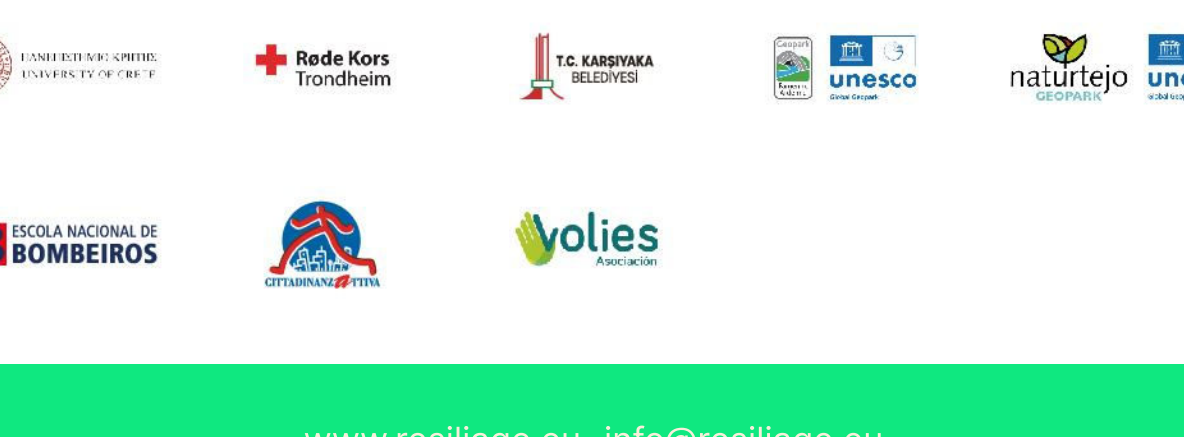
